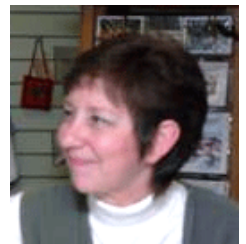
And, in March, on March 17th to be exact, everyone loves the Irish and loves indulging in the "no explanation needed" endeavors.

In 2006, Laurie started a second company, Carlsborg Business Services in response to requests from local businesses and Carlsborg Post office employees who needed copy, faxng, binding and laminating. In May of 2008, she will open a gallery, studio and workshop in the next door suite. "We've designed it as a No-Commission Gallery for artists and a pleasant facility for classes and meetings."

GETTING TO KNOW OUR SEQUIM ARTS MEMBERS FOR MARCH MARILYN HOOSER



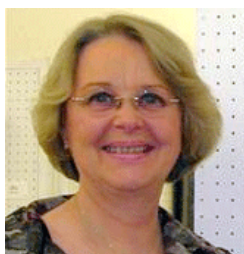

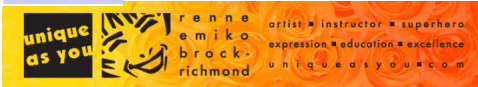

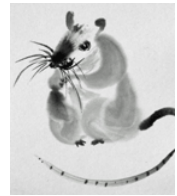
